president is H. L. Stevens. The first scout executive was Mr. C. D. Flagle, and the second was Mr. Ivor G. Thomas. The third executive is Mr. Glenn Everman. When Mr. Everman took charge of the Scout work during May, 1918, there were 156 scouts; today there are 600. Mr. Everman is assisted by two assistant scout executives, Mr. Charles E. Weaver and Mr. Charles E. Hawkinson.

Business Men's Protective Association.

The Business Men's Protective Association, which has a membership of 340 made up of the principal business men of the city, was organized in 1907, and its president throughout the past 13 years has been Mr. Walter S. Clayton. Mr. P. C. March is secretary, and Mr. Edward D. Hodge, business agent. The directors of this association meet once a month, while the entire membership meets once a year.

The Mining Circle.

This circle was organized in 1918, with Mr. H. J. Baron as director. In 1919, the director was Mr. R. G. Dufourcq. No election having been held for 1920, Mr. H. J. Baron is acting president or director. The membership of this circle numbers 130 men representing the mining interests in New Mexico, Arizona, West Texas and Old Mexico.

El Paso Clearing House Association.

The El Paso Clearing House Association became a corporation in 1907, its primary purpose being for the clearing of checks, though it is also intended to bring banking interests closer together, and one of their special tasks is that of passing on subscriptions and budget funds demanded of the business men of El Paso. The first president was Mr. C. R. Morehead; the succeeding presidents were Mr. U. S. Stewart, Jas. G. McNary, A. F. Kerr, F. M. Murchison, and the present president is Mr. R. W. McAfee.

Tri-State Association of Credit Men.

This association was organized December 10, 1918, and Mr. C. S. Nasits has been its president since the organization. The membership in this association is approximately 100. Mr. P. C. March is vice president; Mr. H. E. Christie, treasurer, and Mr. T. E. Blanchard, secretary.

El Paso Real Estate Board.

The El Paso Real Estate Board is made up of men who have rendered great service in the development of El Paso and its valley, and was organized in March, 1916. This board today has a membership of 19 active members and 5 associate members. The first president was Mr. R. E. Sherman, who served during the year 1916; Mr. A. H. Anderson, who served during 1917; Mr. C. H. Leavell, who served during 1918; Mr. J. L. Marr, who served during 1919; and Mr. Geo. R. LeBaron, the present president.

El Paso Music Association.

This association was formed during the summer of 1919, for the purpose of advancing the cause of good music in El Paso by giving the city a municipal band presenting programs throughout the spring and summer months in the open and the symphony orchestra to give not less than six programs during the year at

Liberty Hall. The officers and directors of this association are James G. McNary, James A. Dick, J. C. Wilmarth, Mayor Chas. Davis, Alderman R. C. Semple, Julius Krakauer, A. Schwartz, W. R. Brown, U. S. Stewart, Fred J. Feldman, G. A. Martin, E. C. Davis, S. J. Freudenthal, Henry S. Beach, W. T. Hixon, M. Coblenz, Haymon Krupp, R. Burt Orndorff and John H. Regan, secretary.

Red Cross.

The El Paso Chapter of the American Red Cross grew out of the National work of the Red Cross during the World War. It was organized in 1917, and has a membership in El Paso of between eight and nine thousand. The membership is obtained by annual drives and the membership fee is \$1.00 per year. The first president was Dr. W. L. Brown, who also served during the years of 1918 and 1919. Dr. J. W. Laws was elected president in 1920, succeeding Dr. Brown. The acting general secretary is Mr. R. H. Brown; the secretary of the headquarters is Mrs. Rinéhart, and the executive secretary of the Home Service section is Madam H. F. Worthington.

Travelers' Protective Association.

Post "R" Travelers' Protective Association was organized in El Paso on January 17, 1920, and its membership is mounting up daily so that in the course of a few weeks it has grown to be one of the chief Posts in the state. The president of the Post is Morris J. Boretz; first vice president, C. C. Covington; second vice president, Paul Krupp; third vice president, Louis Chernis; secretary and treasurer, A. Schatsky; state director, R. Weinstein; directors, W. C. Hepburn, Jules Grandmougin (chairman), C. M. Stambough, M. E. Forster and R. R. Mason.

Pioneer Association.

The meeting at which it was decided to organize a Pioneer Association was held on May 10, 1904. Among others the following well known El Paso men were present: Judge W. M. Coldwell, Judge F. E. Hunter, Judge Joseph Magoffin, S. H. Newman, W. W. Bridgers, Juan Hart, Judge Allen Blacker, J. P. Dieter, W. Rheinheimer, Dr. W. Vilas, T. H. Springer, E. Kohlberg, Dan Kelly, and I. G. Gaal.

The first annual meeting was held at Hart's Mill on June 3, 1904, and lasted from one o'clock until seven in the evening.

An item of interest is the account of the first Base Ball Club organized by the Pioneers in May, 1905, and which comprised the following players: W. J. Rand, "Red" Sullivan, E. V. Berrien, Britton Davis, Maury Edwards, Will Race, W. H. Tuttle, C. M. Newman and C. W. Fassett.

Ministerial Alliance

Information is on file with the secretary of the Ministerial Alliance in El Paso which shows that the organization dates back to 1890, but the records for those years between 1890 and 1911 do not seem to be preserved. There are thirty-five members in the alliance today and the president for 1920 is Rev. Milo Atkinson. The presidents since 1911 are: Rev. Charles L. Overstreet, 1911; Rev. Perry J. Rice, 1912; Rev. John E. Abbott, 1913; Rev. H. G. Porter, 1914; Rev. J. F. Williams, 1915; Rev. W. C. Baber, 1916; Rev. Clyde K. Camp-

bell, 1917; Rev. Fuller Swift, 1918; and Rev. Milo Atkinson, 1919. Rev. Rufus C. Baker is the present Secretary of the organization.

United Americans

The United American movement was inaugurated in El Paso during October of 1919 and organization was completed in November, an executive board being created to carry on this special patriotic work made up of the presidents of the various civic associations and clubs of the city. The general work of this movement has been placed in the hands of Manager Roberts of the Chamber of Commerce, and Mr. Roberts has in turn made the movement a special activity of the Junior Department, Burton Bunch, manager.

Insurance Underwriters

The El Paso Insurance Underwriters was formally organized during the winter of 1919, when many of the insurance men of the city came together at a dinner in the Sheldon Grill. The president of the association is Thomas L. Peach and the secretary, Henry T. Bowie.

El Paso Auto Club

The El Paso Auto Club was organized on March 11, 1918, with a membership of 512. The first president was Mr. W. G. Roe. In 1919 Mr. C. M. Harvey was chosen as president, and for 1920 Mr. A. J. Strayer. The membership in 1919 was 483, while the goal for 1920 is 1000. Miss Buena Gilder is secretary of this club and has headquarters in the Chamber of Commerce Building. The club gives out special information on roads and highways to tourists and others, as well as carrying on a definite good roads program.

El Paso Traffic Club

During the first week in January through the work of A. U. Tadlock, traffic manager of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce, a traffic club was formed, which meets regularly each Tuesday for lunch in the Chamber of Commerce Grill. Persons eligible for membership in the club are railroad rate clerks, chief clerks or officials, traffic manager of industrial firms, traffic manager of commercial concerns, male employees of the traffic department of the Chamber of Commerce or members of the Chamber of Commerce traffic committee. The officers of the club are: S. H. Wilson, president; Richard Warren, first vice-president; J. L. Stewart, second vice-president; Wade Cunningham, third vice-president; A. U. Tadlock, secretary-treasurer. The officers named with the following comprise the board of directors: W. S. Davidson, W. G. Martindale, W. S. Stallings, E. W. Skipworth, C. C. Lassiter, J. H. Pierson, W. R. Brown, O. W. Callahan and J. G. Nealey.

El Paso Chapter American Association of Engineers

The president of this association is L. M. Lawson, project manager of the U. S. Reclamation Service at El Paso, president; J. L. Campbell, vice-president; C. R. Folk, secretary and L. A. White, treasurer. These officers with the following constitute the executive board: P. E. French, C. W. Bagley, B. L. Sullivan, R. S. Moore and J. F. Woodyard. The association was formed on February 12th, 1920.
