



TYPES OF MODERN RESIDENCES—MANHATTAN HEIGHTS ADDITION

Manhattan Heights is typical of the better residential sections. It is located near Five Points, a suburban business district about thirty blocks from the heart of the main business section. The principal residence sections extend from the G. H. & S. A. tracks to the outer limits of Fort Bliss, a distance of approximately five miles.
