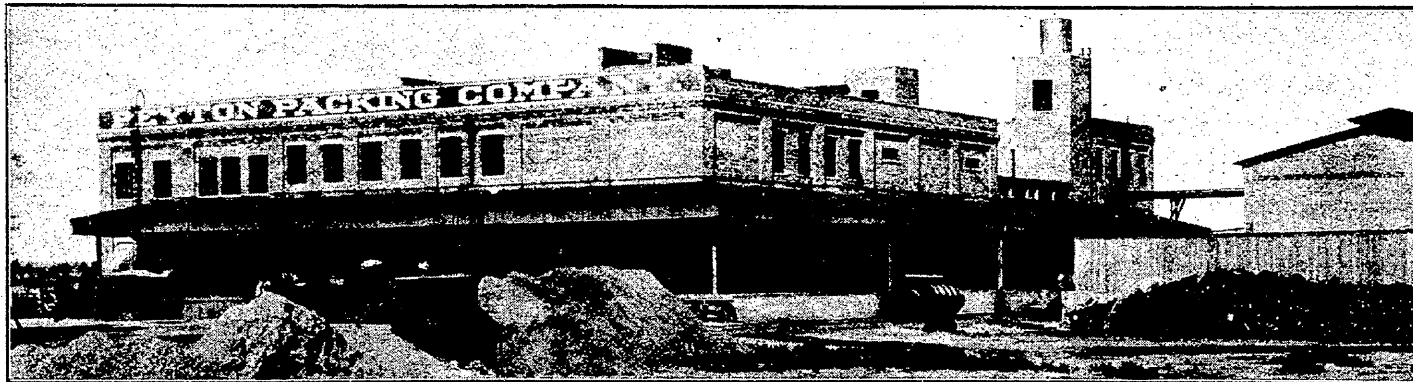

for the killing and preparing of Live Stock for distribution in the SOUTHWEST, under the supervision of the Bureau of Animal Industry, and is now known as Establishment No. 126.

The Plant covers approximately 10 acres, served by a private side-track of the El Paso & Southwestern Railroad.

The operations include killing and dressing of beef, pork and mutton, supplying all known cuts to the wholesale trade, as well as the production of sausages (fresh and smoked, including Mexican), hams, bacon, dried salt meats, and lard; also the dressing of poultry, and the handling of eggs and cheese.

The Plant is fully equipped with modern and ample chill rooms and cold storage, protected by a system of refrigeration manufactured by its own power plant. It has its own electric system. An artesian well was sunk on the property to a depth of 1100 feet, providing an inexhaustible supply of pure water, so necessary to conform to the strict regulations and supervision of Government Inspection as to sanitation, and guaranteeing to the public the highest quality of meat food products—made ready and delivered to the trade bright, fresh and wholesome.

There is no other such plant within a radius of three days shipping into El Paso and its territory; and the public and the dealer are interested in this point, because **Peyton's Products** may be accepted as the **FRESHEST** to be obtained.

Prior to the opening of this Plant, Live Stock was shipped largely to the big packing centers, with the result that the shipper, suffered a heavy shrink, and paid the high freight cost. Now the Live Stock Grower can find a market in El Paso—it being the boast of this Company that at no time since it opened its doors has it been necessary to refuse to buy

direct from the Grower any Live Stock suitable for killing. This point is of great consequence to the Southwest Live Stock Grower, and it is the hope of Mr. Peyton that more of the Live Stock Growers will take advantage of this fact and increase their offerings of cattle, hogs and sheep.

The output of By-Products (hides, horns, hoofs, bones, and fertilizing materials, viz: dried blood and tankage) is of considerable consequence, and means that with their more efficient methods of operating, and the saving of these By-Products, a better market is possible for the Live Stock, and a better grade of fresh meats is constantly available for the wholesale trade.
