George Baggs, one of El Paso's most prominent citizens, died last night at his rooms, of kidney disease. He has been more or less sick for the last six months but was not considered dangerous until last Monday, since which time has rapidly failed. He was a native of Baltimore aged fifty-seven years and was a Pacific coast pioneer, having arrived in California in the fall of 1849. Besides California he has lived and done business in Oregon, Colorado and Wyoming before coming to this state. He was never married and his only known relations being a nephew, living here, and two brothers, one in Stockton, California, and another in Philadelphia. He left a large amount of valuable property, the disposition of which is contained in a will made last Monday. He was honorable in his business transactions and a worthy, enterprising citizen whose loss will be felt in the community. He will be buried at ten o'clock to-morrow morning.
