

ALBERT BALDWIN.

Albert Baldwin, after whom the Baldwin sanitarium of El Paso was named, died suddenly Sunday morning at his fishing lodge near New Orleans. Mr. Baldwin had never visited El Paso, but his son, David G. Baldwin, of this city, founded the Baldwin sanitarium in 1904, naming it after his father. Mrs. Albert Baldwin, who died last August, visited El Paso six years ago, and was known by many El Pasoans.

Albert Baldwin was prominent in New Orleans business circles, and prided himself on being a "self made" man. He was active in founding the New Orleans National bank, and was prominent in promotion of the Mardi Gras festivities in the Louisiana city. He was many years a Mason. Mr. Baldwin went south from his home in East Jaffrey, N. H. shortly before the civil war. He was 78 years of age.

The funeral was held Monday morning at New Orleans.
