

H. F. Baldwin Dies Sunday In Hospital

Henry Fay Baldwin, pioneer El Pasoan resident, of 4809 Hastings St., died Sunday in a local hospital. He had been a resident of El Paso for 56 years, and has been active in church, lodge and civic affairs of this community. He was manufacturer's representative for the Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Co. for 25 years before his retirement in 1948. Mr. Baldwin was 67 years of age.

He was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church and was a member of El Paso Rotary Club where he had 17 years perfect attendance. He was a member of El Paso Masonic Lodge No. 130; El Paso Commandry No. 18 Knights Templar; El Paso Chapter No. 157 Royal Arch Masons where he had served as High Priest in 1931; El Paso Council No. 98, Royal and Select Masters where he had served as Thrice Illustrious Master in 1924-1925.

He was a member of El Maida Temple, A. A. O. N. M. S. of El Paso. He also was a member of the Knife and Fork Club of El Paso. The El Paso Chamber of Commerce, the Sun Carnival Association, the Sons of the Sun and the Louisiana Society of the Sons of The American Revolution. He had been very active in blind work and had served as a director of

the El Paso Lighthouse for the Blind for many years.

He attended the University of Colorado and New Mexico A&M College.

Mr. Baldwin is survived by his widow, Mrs. Lillian Holman Baldwin; two daughters, Mrs. J. W. Woodfin and Mrs. Joshua E. Nagley of El Paso; a son, Henry Fay Baldwin of Bellaire, Texas; a sister, Mrs. William Tompkins West of New Orleans; three brothers, Albert Baldwin of New Orleans, Seth L. Baldwin of Covington, La., and Robert Bruce Baldwin of Slidell, La.; an aunt, Mrs. Mathilde S. Baldwin of Covington, La.; eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. Out-of-town relatives are expected to attend funeral services.

The family requests that flowers be omitted, and contributions may be made to the Sanctuary of the new First Presbyterian Church or to the Lighthouse for the Blind.
