## C. C. BALLINGER DIES AT ANTHONY

## Former El Paso Business Man Passes Away Suddenly; Funeral Here.

C. C. Ballinger, for many years a pioneer business man, died at Authony, N. M., Thursday morning at S oclock of apoplexy after an illness of only one-half hour.

Mr. Ballinger has been living with his sons at Anthony for a number of years and had been in his usual good health until a short time prior to his death when he was stricken and expired almost before his sons could gather at his bedside.

He is survived by four sons. Paul, eged 15; Philip, aged 12; Joe aged ten: John, aged five. His wife died several years ago. She was a sister of Fred Weckerle, of El Paso, and was well known in El Paso.

In Livery Business.

He was engaged in the livery business with J. J. Longwell, forming a partnership with him about 16 years ago. Three years later this partnership was dissolved and Mr. Ballinger entered the livery business for himself. He went to Anthony about one year ago and had been living on his farm near there. He come to El Paso in the early 80's and was well known to the pioneer settlers of the city. He was 59 years old at the time of his death. The body was removed to El Paso Thursday in a motor hearse and the funeral will be held here, probably Friday.
