

C. M. Barber Taken By Death

Was Once President Of Country Club

News of the death in Albuquerque of C. M. Barber, former resident of El Paso, was received by his brother, L. M. Barber, 3009 Richmond street. Funeral service were held today in Albuquerque.

Mr. Barber was associated with his brother in the automobile business here in 1903, and sold many of the first cars in the city. He was president of the El Paso County Club at one time, a Potentate of El Maida Temple, and holder of the Shrine ring.

Mr. Barber left El Paso in 1910, going to Albuquerque, where he engaged in the automobile business for several years, later entering building and contracting work. He retired several years ago.

He was 66. His widow and two sons, both in the armed services of the country, survive.
