PASO BUILDER **DIES AT COAST**

C. E. Barglebaugh, 46, former El Paso architect for First Mortgage and other El Paso buildings, died Friday at his home in Redondo Beach, Calif. He died of heart failure, following severe burns. No details of the burns have been received.

Barglebaugh was stricken with paralysis caused by high blood pressure while en route to Los Angeles over three years ago. He had been in ill health since then.

During the war Barglebaugh was one of the 12 men selected by the government to serve on the ship builders' board. He was formerly secretary of the National Architect and Structural Assn. He invented the concrete ships used during the war.

Barglebaugh came to El Paso as a young man and married Daisy Millican, sister of A. R. Millican of El Paso. Mrs. Barglebaugh died four years ago while attending a Baptist convention in Dallas.

Barglebaugh was a 32nd degree Mason and a Shriner.
