Mrs. Beall, 90, Passes Away

Prominent Woman Had Lived In El Paso Nearly Half Century.

Mrs. Margaret Ragsdale Beall, 90. daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Ragsdale, pioneer Texan and widow of the late Capt. T. J. Beall, died last night at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. E. E. Neff. 514 Randolph street. She had lived here 49 years. She had been ill only a week.

Coming to Texas from Mississippi when a child, Mrs. Bealf lived with her family in Bryan, Texas, until her marriage to Capt. Beall. In 1882 Mr. and Mrs. Bealf moved to El Paso to make their home. Capt. Bealf became prominent as a lawyer throughout the state as a member of the law firm of Davis, Bealf & Kemp. Bealf school was named for him.

Social Leader.

Mrs. Beall soon became a social and givic leader and did much for the advancement of social and civic life among El Paso women. She was one of the early founders of the El Paso Woman's club. She was a Christian Scientist by religious faith.

Beside Mrs. Neff, Mrs. Beall is survived by two other daughters, Mrs. J. F. Williams, of El Paso, but visiting in Europe, and Mrs. Norman Carmichael, of Rancho Santa Fe, Calif., and one son, T. D. Beall, rancher of Gallego, Chihuahua. Mexico.
