

T. D. Beall Rites Set Wednesday

Thomas D. Beall, 528 Marthmont way, died yesterday at the age of 91.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at Kaster and Maxon Downtown Chapel. The Rev. Gene Garrison will officiate and burial will be in Evergreen cemetery.

Mr. Beall, a retired rancher, had been a resident of El Paso for 30 years. He was the son of Capt. Thomas Jermia Beall for whom Beall School was named. They started the first law firm, Kemp, Beall and White in El Paso.

HE WAS GRADUATED from Texas A and M in 1901 and was a sergeant in the Texas Rangers between 1910 and 1916.

In 1916 he was a civilian scout and guide for Gen. John J. Pershing, who led an expedition into Mexico in pursuit of Pancho Villa.

In 1923 he went to Chihuahua, Mexico and started his ranching business. At one time he was a millionaire and company owner of five ranches.

Mr. Beall was a 50-year member of the Sierra Blanca Masonic Lodge No. 1063.

He is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Margaret B. Lengefeld, El Paso; a son, Thomas J. Beall, Mexico, and four grandchildren.
