

FRANK BEHR, 64, DIES AT RANCH OF C. E. KELLEY

Frank Behr, aged 64 years, a resident of El Paso for 14 years, dropped dead Tuesday morning at 8 o'clock on the C. E. Kelly ranch at Ysleta, as he was getting in an automobile to come to El Paso.

Mr. Kelly and A. Schildnecht were with him.

Dr. S. W. Crossley, of Ysleta, was called, but Mr. Behr died before he arrived.

Justice of the peace Alex Gonzales, of Ysleta, said death was due to heart disease.

Louis E. Behr, assistant superintendent of El Paso water works, his brother, and W. G. Walz, a nephew by marriage, were on an automobile trip in New Mexico at the time of his death.

Bernard P. Behr, another brother, and Mrs. Theodore G. Barstow, a sister, live in St. Louis. Benjamin and Edward Behr, his other brothers, live in Chicago.

Edmond E. Behr of The Herald staff, is his nephew.

Mr. Behr had held several city and county offices here.
