

George Berliner was buried with Masonic honors yesterday morning in the Masonic cemetery at Concordia. Undertaker Ross and the pall bearers went over to the other side in the morning when the train came up from the south, and at the Santa Fe depot, the remains were removed to the hearse and escorted to Masonic hall. The pall bearers were Messrs Morehead, Kern, D. Kelly, G. W. Davis, John Julian Capt. Beall. The body was found in a soldered Mexican casket of the German pattern with convex sides, and a small plate of glass just over the face. There were no handles or trimmings whatever on the casket, so the undertaker attended to that ere bringing the body up town. The services at the hall were conducted after the impressive and beautiful ritual of the masonic order, the floral decorations were fine, and the singing excellent. The knights templar, the blue lodge and the fire department turned out with full ranks, the knights acting as escorts for the lodge. The firemen had all of the apparatus out which made a good showing. There were over twenty carriages in the procession, and many friends followed the hearse to the grave where the final rites were concluded. The deceased was well and favorably known in El Paso and will be much missed.
