FORMER E. P. RESIDENT KILLS SELF IN CHINA

E. G. Berrien Found Dead in Shanghai; Had Been in Ill Health

E. G. Berrien, 52, former El Pasoan, today committed suicide in Shanghai, China, by shooting himself with a revolver, a United Press dispatch said.

Mr. Berrien, an employe of the British-American Tobacco Co., had been ill recently.

Mrs. Eliza Loomis, 1215 Magoffin Ave., sister of Mr. Berrien, said he was in El Paso on a visit last October.

Two brothers, I. L. Berrien, Beverly Hills, Cal., and William J. Berrien, Berkeley, Cal., another sister, Mrs. J. Worth Maxwell, 1217 N. Oregon St., and his father, Edward V. Berrien, 1215 Magoffin Ave., are other survivors.

Mr. Berrien was advertising manager in China for the tobacco company.

He was born in St. Louis and was educated in El Paso schools and the Rose Polytechnic School, Terre Haute, Ind.
