

PIONEER WOMAN OF CITY IS DEAD

Mrs. Eliza L. Berrien Passes Away at the Family Home.

Mrs. Eliza L. Berrien, wife of E. V. Berrien, for 36 years a resident of El Paso, died Tuesday morning at 7:15 o'clock at the family home, 1215 Magoffin avenue. She was 59 years of age. For the past month Mrs. Berrien had been very ill.

Mr. Berrien opened the first furniture store in El Paso, the Emerson and Berrien store, in 1882.

Mrs. Berrien was a singer in her church choir for the past 36 years and up until a month before her death.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock at the Immaculate Conception church. The services will be conducted by the right Rev. father Roy. Burial will be in the Catholic Concordia cemetery.

Mrs. Berrien is survived by her husband, two daughters, Mrs. Ralph Loomis and Miss Estella Berrien, of El Paso, and four sons, I. L. Berrien, of Bisbee, Ariz.; Edward G. Berrien, of Lima, Peru, South America; Lieut. commander T. G. Berrien, of the United States navy, and William G. Berrien, of El Paso.
