

Adolph Blumenthal Dies at Age of 84

Adolph Blumenthal, pioneer El Paso merchant, died in a hospital last night.

Mr. Blumenthal was 84. He was born in Germany and came to the United States when he was 16. He went to La Port, Ia., where he was in the clothing business with his brothers, Sam and Bernard. They came to El Paso in 1892 and opened the Gold Needle Clothing Co., which later became Blumenthal and Bros. Co.

He was active for many years in civic affairs. He was a member of Temple Mt. Sinai and was a 32nd Degree Mason.

Mr. Blumenthal was active in his business until he became ill nine days ago.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Alma Blumenthal; a niece, Mrs. Jeannette Landenthal; a nephew, Karl Blumenthal, all of
