

HEART ATTACK FATAL TO BOOTH

Deputy County Clerk Dies
In Apartment of Friend
After Ride

Funeral arrangements for George H. Booth, 44, deputy county clerk, who died suddenly last night, will not be made until his mother and sister arrive here from Ridgewood, N. J.

His body is at Peak-Hagedorn mortuary.

Mr. Booth died of a heart attack in the apartment of Mrs. Jane Hawkins, 328 W. Missouri St., who had been his friend for several years.

Mr. Booth had been ill for about a year. He was waiting in his automobile outside Masonic hospital, where Mrs. Hawkins was visiting a friend when he suffered an attack last night.

He asked Mrs. Hawkins to drive him to her apartment or his room at Hotel Hilton.

Mrs. Hawkins drove to her apartment and telephoned for Dr. E. W. Rheinheimer. Mr. Booth died before the physician arrived.

Mr. Booth was born in El Paso and attended the old Central school. He lived in El Paso all his life except for a few years he worked in Amarillo.

Mr. Booth was in the insurance business until he entered the clerk's office as a deputy about 12 years ago.

He was past exalted ruler of the Elks lodge and was member of the board of trustees at the time of his death.

The late Thomas Booth, his father, was a master mechanic for the Santa Fe railroad for 30 years. He was a pioneer citizen of El Paso and made his home at 305 W. Rio Grande.

Mr. Booth was unmarried.

He is survived by his mother who makes her home with his sister, Mrs. Sampson B. Peacocke, Ridgewood, N. J. They will come to El Paso to attend the funeral.
