H. C. BORCHERDING DIED YESTERDAY

Oldest Employe in Point of Service Connected with G. H. & S. A. Railroad at El Paso.

H. C. Borcherding, one of the oldest railroad men on the G., H. & S. A. in El Paso, in point of service, died yesterday afternoon at the family residence, 606 North Stanton street. Mr. Borcherding would have been 50 years of age on July 6, had be lived.

He had been ill for several weeks, and for the past few days his death has been expected. The immediate cause of death was cancer of the slomach, from which he had suffered for some time.

Deceased leaves a wife and five children, four boys and a daughter. They are W. E., H. A., H. R. and C. I. Horcherding, all of this city, and Mrs. Wm. Eichbaum of Daughs. His wife and children were at his bedside when death came.

Employed by G. H. 33 Years.

H. C. Borcherding was born in Madison, Ind. From there he moved to California with his purents, and in 1882 came to 12 Paso. He has been a the employ of the G. H. read for 23 years, seven years in California and 26 years here. At the time of death he was foreman of the G. H. car shops in this city, which position he had held for many years. He had charge of all matters periaining to the curs of that company in the requir shops, and was directly under J. J. Ryan of Houston, superintendent of amilie power and machinery. He was well known to all the milroad men who run put of El Paso, and his death will be regretted by all.

Funeral Tuesday.

The funeral will be held at 2:29 o'clock Tuesday afternoon from the residence, with interment at Concordia. The pastor of the First M. E. church will hold services at the residence and the Woodmen of the World will conduct services at the grave. Relatives of the deceased who reside in California and Colorado have been informed of Mr. Borcherding's death, and it is probable the services will be postponed until their arrival.
