Funeral services for Mrs. Henry T. Bowie of 3618 Fort Blvd., who died Monday, will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday in First Presbyterian Church by the Rev. George W. Burroughs and the Rev. T. Stewart Coffman.

Mrs. Bowie, the former Margaretta McNary, had resided in El Paso for 53 years. She taught home and family life education in El Paso County schools from 1934 to 1943 and was president of the YWCA board for eight years during which the building program was conducted.

A member of First Presbyterian Church, she had served as a deaconess and, prior to her retirement, as an official church visitor. She taught the Philathea Class for 29 years and the Clipper Class for nine years. She was also a national officer of World Service Council.

Mrs. Bowie, born in Bloomington, Ind., was graduated from Tarkio College in Tarkio, Mo., in 1896 and taught school in Tarkio, Pa., Blairsville, Pa., where she was head of the Latin Department at Blairsville College and in Las Vegas, N.M.

Survivors include a niece, Mrs. Sheldon A. Strong of El Paso; one brother, George R. McNary, Greensburg, Pa., and two grandsons, Hugh M. Walker III and Richard Walker of El Paso.

Mrs. Margaretta McNary Bowie of 3618 Fort Boulevard died today. She had been a resident of El Paso 53 years.

She was a member of First Presbyterian Church, where she had served as a deaconess, and, before her retirement, had served on the staff as a visitor.
