Edwin M. Bray, 72, 965 West Xandell Boulevard, pionaer El Paso business man and civic leader, died last night at a local hospital after an operation necessitated by a lung abacess which followed pneumonth.

Mr. Bray had operated the store at the El Paso Smelter for the American Smelting & Refining Company continuously since 1885. When he came to El Paso from Spectro, N. M., where he was connected with the Sterling Brothers' merchandising enterprises.

He had many other business interests. He was president of the Hoyt Furniture Company from 1921 until 1931, when it was merged with the Rogers Furniture Company, and was vice president of the merged firm until 1932. He was vice president of the Hoyt Company for many years before he became president.

Was Civic Leader.

He was a member of the board of directors of the old City National Bank and of the old Rio Grande Valley Bank and Trust Company.

His record as a civic leader includes presidency of the Y. M. C. A. when the present Central Y. M. C. A. building was erected; presidency of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce, and presidency of the Community Chest. In addition, he was a member and past president of the Kiwanis Club and at one time was active in Boy Scout work.
