

Pioneer El Pasoan Is Victim Of Death

Philip F. Brinck, a pioneer El Pasoan who died Monday morning in the home of his niece, Mrs. Harry Owsley, 221 West Nevada street, after a short illness of a few days, was born July 17, 1854, 71 years ago, in Minden, La.

At an early age he moved with his parents to Jefferson, Texas, where he lived until manhood, coming to El Paso in the early 80's. His death marks the passing of one of the earliest pioneers.

He engaged in the wholesale produce business here and up to his death was an active member of his firm, the P. F. Brinck company.

He leaves behind him many mourners who loved and appreciated his noble qualities. His survivors are four nieces, Mrs. Lillian Zarzoran, Mrs. Harry Owsley, Mrs. William Collins and Mrs. Arthur Rule.
