

## Funeral Services Monday Afternoon For H. W. Broaddus

Funeral services for Horace W. Broaddus, 62 years old, who died Sunday morning in his home, 1131 East Yandell boulevard, will be held at 3:30 o'clock Monday afternoon in the chapel of Hartford mortuary and at 4 o'clock in the Church of St. Clement, with the Rev. B. T. Kemmerer, rector of the church, officiating. Masonic services will be conducted at the grave.

### Real Estate Offices Close.

Real estate offices were closed at 1 p. m. for the remainder of the day as a mark of respect to Mr. Broaddus.

As a cattleman and real estate man, Horace W. Broaddus was one of the leading figures in the business world of the southwest for many years.

Coming from his birthplace, Glasgow, Mich., 40 years ago, Mr. Broaddus entered the cattle business with the Newman brothers—E. S., G. T. and H. L. After 20 years of success in the cattle business Mr. Broaddus in 1902 formed with Charles Leavell the real estate firm of Broaddus & Leavell.

### Partnership With Sons.

After a prosperous business the firm was dissolved and Mr. Broaddus entered into real estate business with George LeBaron, under the firm name of Broaddus & LeBaron. Mr. LeBaron later went to California to make his residence and the firm of H. W. Broaddus & Sons, which Mr. Broaddus was senior member of at the time of his death, was organized by him. Associated with their father were Francis and Morgan Broaddus, Horace, Jr., and Herbert attend the public schools here.

Mr. Broaddus in 1892 married Miss Bessie Cole, El Paso high school graduate, who survives him. He is also survived by the following brothers: William, John, Ernest, Lee, Oscar and Hastings Broaddus; the following sisters: Mrs. Wally Dailey, Mrs. John Dailey and Miss Julia Broaddus, all of Montana.

### Shriner and Elk.

At the time of his death Mr. Broaddus belonged to the Pioneers' association, Rotary club, Country club and Toltec club, was a charter member of the local Elks' club, and a Shriner. He was a vestryman in the Church of St. Clement, Episcopal.

Mr. Broaddus was an active member of the El Paso Real Estate board at his death.
