

CAUGHT COLD WHILE FIGHT-
ING THE PIERSON FIRE.

The Trouble Developed into Pneumonia and Caused the Death of Albert F. Brossy.

Albert F. Brossy died at Hotel Dieu yesterday evening at 4 o'clock at the age of 33 years. Mr. Brossy was taken sick last Sunday and went to the hospital on Monday. The sickness is said to be the result of a cold caused by getting wet while hot from fighting the flames in the Pierson hotel fire. His cold commenced that night and kept getting worse until it developed into pneumonia.

Albert F. Brossy and wife came here from Detroit, Mich., about two years ago in search of health for Mrs. Brossy, who is an invalid. Finding the climate satisfactory and the town full of business Mr. Brossy decided to cast his lot in El Paso and in a few months he established Brossy's Cleaning and Dyeing Works, which he sold last September. After disposing of that business Mr. Brossy and his cousin, A. L. Livingston, established the El Paso Sheet Metal Works, in which he was interested until his death.

Mr. Brossy was known as a hustler. Everybody speaks well of him as a business man and a gentleman. He was a member of the Knights of Pythias and the Order of Eagles. These lodges will conduct the obsequies at his burial tomorrow.

Rev. M. C. Martin, of the Episcopal church, will conduct the funeral services at the family home, 908 North Florence street, at 2:30 tomorrow afternoon, after which the body will be interred in the K. of P. plot in Evergreen cemetery.

The only relatives of Mr. Brossy, besides his wife, living in El Paso are his cousin, Mr. Livingston, and his sister, Mrs. George Hyde, wife of the assistant superintendent of the smelter.
