

# EDGAR D. BROWN TAKEN BY DEATH

Was Resident of Clint for Past  
25 Years

Edgar D. Brown, pioneer resident of Clint, died today in a local hospital, following a long illness. He was 61.

Mr. Brown, who had lived in Clint for 25 years, was born in Alvarado Sept. 22, 1875. He was the son of the late Capt. and Mrs. A. J. Brown, pioneers of Johnson County.

In 1893, Mr. Brown moved to Mexico City, where he held a position with the Standard Oil Co., until 1901. From there he went to Dallas, entering the insurance business with his father.

Mr. Brown established the Edgar D. Brown Co., general merchandise store at Clint, in 1911. He formerly owned several farms in the Clint area.

He was prominent in the civic development of Clint, and was instrumental in getting roads built through the town years ago.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Bess Ferris Brown, a son, Edgar D. Brown Jr., both of Clint, and two daughters, Ona Brown, Clint, and Miss Kate J. Brown, of Dallas.
