

WHITE HOUSE'S FOUNDER DIES IN PARIS HOME

Cable advice has reached Myrtil Coblentz that his uncle, Felix Brunshwig, former El Pasoan and founder of the White House, is dead in Paris.

Many years ago Mr. Brunshwig came to El Paso from Mexico and opened the White House at San Antonio and Oregon streets. Several years later, wishing to retire from business, he sold his interests in the store to his nephews, Myrtil and Gaston Coblentz, leaving El Paso for his old home in Paris, where he has lived the past 15 years.

In the spring, news reached Mr. Coblentz that his uncle's health was failing, and, accompanied by Mrs. Coblentz, he made a hurried trip to Paris to be at his bedside. Arriving in Paris they found him much improved and in cheerful spirits. The cablegram saying Mr. Brunshwig had passed away came as a shock to Mr. Coblentz and friends in El Paso.
