

Miss Anne Bucher, E.P. Resident, Dies

Miss Anne Bucher, of 700 West Yandell drive, died yesterday in a local hospital. She had been a resident of El Paso 37 years. Miss Bucher was a member of a pioneer family. Her father, William Bucher, was prominent in banking in Southern New Mexico and El Paso. She owned and managed First National building from 1936 to 1959, when she sold the building, and was one of the first women members of the National Building Owners and Managers Assn.

SHE WAS active with El Paso Humane Society, and a past president. This year, she received the President's Award for outstanding service to the society.

She was a member of El Paso Real Estate Board, El Paso Art Museum Assn., National Assn. of Arts and Letters, El Paso Historical Society; Knife and Fork Club, and

West El Paso Republican Women's Club.
