June 8, 2008. He was surrounded by his adoring family when he entered the Kingdom of God. Jesus was an all star football, basketball and track athlete at Bowie High School in the 1930's. Jesus con-

tinued his athletic achievements at the Texas College of Mines from 1938-1941, where he was recognized for numerous athletic achievements to include a 24 year unbroken passing record. His performance for Texas College of Mines caught the attention of several NFL scouts and subsequently received draft letters from Philadelphia Eagles, Detroit Lions and New York Giants. Unfortunately, Jesus was drafted into the U.S. Army before accepting any NFL draft letters. Jesus served as an enlistee in the U.S. Army and later with U.S. Naval Reserve. While serving in the Army he also played for the U.S. Army Football Team. Upon his service with the U.S. Military he returned to El Paso where he met, married and spent 59 years with his loving wife, Adelina. Jesus worked for the U.S. Postal Service for 30 years and retired in 1985. During his retirement, Jesus and his loving wife traveled and enjoyed their retirement

together. Jesus was a lifetime member of the Segura-McDonald Veterans of Foreign Wars Post, a member of the Alta Vista Optimist Club and volunteered for many years at Sierra Medical Center. Jesus was inducted into the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996 and some of his most cherished athletic memorabilia is permanently displayed at the UTEP Paul Durham Athletic Center. He will be missed dearly and memories of his warmhearted, generous, witty, humorous and loving spirit will always be treasured and by family and friends.
