
Death of Mrs. W. H. Burgess.

At 12:30 o'clock this morning Mrs. Ada D. Burgess, wife of W. H. Burgess, died at her home of pneumonia with attendant heart trouble. She had been sick but a few days, and at the start no serious difficulty was anticipated, it being thought she had contracted malarial fever on her recent trip to San Marcos. On yesterday morning the pneumonia symptoms were present and from that time on she rapidly failed. She retained consciousness until the end, talking with her husband a few moments before her death.

Her death is doubly pathetic in that her mother, Mrs. D. J. Dean, expired within less than a week. In life mother and daughter were like sisters and the love between them was strong beyond the ordinary, and in death they are not separated.

The warm sympathy of the whole community goes out to the bereaved in their double loss and all the kindly services that loving friends can render has been done for the deceased and for the survivors. No consolation that can be offered to the living that will be so refreshing as the thousand remembrances that will constantly well up of the pure, unselfish, Christian lives, replete with their multitudinous acts of self denial and love.
