Once Known To Everyone.
When they first came to El Paso
the Camozzes located on North Oregon street, at the southwest corner of Franklin, where they did business for many years. They conducted an ice cream parlor at the location and manfactured ice cream in the rear for household use.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Camozze were well known to everyone in El Paso at that time and "Camozze's ice cream parlor" was a popular place.

When the band played in Carnegie

square or there was a downtown celebration of any kind, people stood in line afterwards to get tables in Camozze's. This was before the Elite opened in El Paso. When Clarence Pickrell opened the Elite where the S. P. ticket office is now located on North Oregon street, it cut into the Camozze business considerably. Then the gas company took over the build-ing in which Camozze was located and he was forced to move.
