

**Dr. Campbell Dead.**

Yesterday morning at about 8 o'clock Dr. E. L. Campbell died of heart disease. Thursday he was on duty and though feeling unwell was still merry. Yesterday morning at about 2:30 he sent a messenger for his neighbor, W. B. McLachlan, who he desired to tell good-bye. Dr. Irvin and Viles were both summoned, but nothing could be done and at 8 o'clock the spirit of Dr. Campbell gently passed away. The deceased came to El Paso from Indiana, and occupied a position of trust in Dr. Irvin's drug store. A fond young wife and two children are left to mourn the untimely taking off of a happy young husband and father.

### Sudden Death of Dr. Campbell.

Doctor E. L. Campbell passed away at 3 o'clock this morning with heart disease. He knew he had the disease for about two years, but was unwilling to talk about it, and has felt worse during the last month than usual. Yesterday morning he sent a message down to the drug store of Dr. W. A. Irvin, where he has been acting as bookkeeper and collector for five years, that if he did not feel better towards noon he would not come down to work. About 2:30 this morning he asked that W. B. McLachlin, who lives next door on San Francisco street, he called in, and asked that gentleman to telephone for Dr. Irvin, which Mr. McLachlin started to do, when he was called back by the sick man who wanted to shake hands and bid him good by, as he said he did not think he would see him again. Mr. McLachlin went and telephoned for Dr. Irvin, who arrived and found the patient very low, and administered some medicine which revived the action of the heart for about ten minutes, and then he gradually passed away from heart failure. Dr. Vilas was sent for, but when he arrived life was extinct. The deceased gentleman was about 38 years old. His mother lives in Waincaville, Ohio, and he has a brother in business in Kokomo, Indiana, where he himself practiced medicine for some time. He leaves a wife and two children, as well as a very large circle of friends in this city to mourn his loss.
