DEATH CLAIMS LUM CAMPBELL

Son of Former Mayor, 73, Succumbs at Home

Lum F. Campbell, 73, pioneer resident of El Paso, died Tuesday morning at the home, 3009 Louisville, after a brief illness. He died at 8 a.m. Heart disease was given as the cause of death.

Mr. Campbell, with a brother, Edger, built and operated the Wigwam theater. The family still retains an interest in the property. He retired 10 years ago to devote his time to his extensive property holdings.

Enlisting in the Texas Rangers while young, Mr. Campbell served three years with that organization. He came to El Paso in 1881.

At one time his father, Robert, served as El Paso postmaster, mayor and internal revenue collector at Austin.

Mr. Campbell left his widow, Elizabeth; a brother, Edgar of California; two sisters, Mrs. Adelle Wright of New York, and Mrs. Minnie Aloe of San Antonio.

The body was taken to the Hartford mortuary under whose directions funeral services are being arranged.
