

S. CAMPBELL DIES FROM PNEUMONIA

Son of Former Mayor and Pioneer Resident of El Paso; Ill Four Days.

Stafford Campbell, son of the lato Col. R. L. Campbell and Mrs. Phoebe Campbell, pioneer residents of El Paso, died of pneumonia at 7 o'clock Saturday morning at his valley home, seven miles east of El Paso. He had been ill but four days.

Mr. Campbell, who was 46 years of age, had been a resident of El Paso for over 30 years. He was a star athlete in his college days at the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Ind. At the time of his death, he was secretary of the Wigram Bowling and Athletic club of El Paso. During his college days he was a member of the Notre Dame college crew, football and baseball teams and in later years became prominent as an amateur baseball and tennis player and a bowler. He was also interested in real estate business in El Paso.

His father, Col. Campbell, was a former postmaster here, and served a term as mayor.

Children in Los Angeles.

Mr. Campbell was twice married. Mrs. Ethel Campbell and a son and daughter, who are in school in Los Angeles, Cal.; two brothers, Lum F. Campbell, of El Paso, and Edgar E. Campbell, who resides in Santa Monica, Cal., and two sisters, Mrs. Adele Wright, of New York, and Mrs. Minnie Alice, of Fort McPherson, Ga., survive the deceased.

Funeral arrangements had not been completed.
