

Carrasco Services Set For Today

Rosary services will be held at 8 p. m., Wednesday in the Kaster and Maxon chapel for 19-year-old Pfc. Ricardo Carrasco, who was killed in front line action in Korea last July 6.

The body of the former Austin High School student will arrive with a military escort at 2 p. m. Wednesday.

Funeral mass will be said at 9 a. m., Thursday in the Church of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Burial will be in the National Cemetery at Ft. Bliss with full military honors.

Carrasco played a leading role in the film "Quiet Day" which was filmed in Korea. A few days before the film was completed he requested he be sent back to the front line, where he was killed. He was summoned from the front lines to take part in the film.

The native-born Korean war hero is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Justo Carrasco of 2601 Aurora St., five brothers, Justo Jr., Pedro, Gilberto, Armando and Rudy, all of El Paso; two sisters, Josephine and Estela, and his grandmother Mrs. Justina Carrasco, also of El Paso.
