

A. Coblentz, 62, Of White House, Succumbs Here

Arthur Coblentz, 62, stockholder and member of the firm of the White House, died at 7 p. m. Wednesday after a long illness.

Mr. Coblentz was the twin brother of the late Myrtil Coblentz, president of the White House, who died Aug. 9 of this year. His other brother, the late Gaston Coblentz, died June 17, 1942, thus all three brothers dying in a little over a year.

Mr. Coblentz had been a resident of El Paso for the past 43 years. He has resided in Hotel Paso del Norte for the past several years. He was a bachelor.

CAME TO JUAREZ

TO LIVE WITH UNCLE.

Mr. Coblentz came to Juarez in 1898 from Paris, France, to live with his uncle, Felix Brunschwig, a merchant. In 1900 he came to El Paso with his two brothers where he became associated with them in the White House Department Store.

He is survived by two sisters-in-law, Mrs. Myrtil Coblentz, of El Paso, and Mrs. Gaston Coblentz, of New York City, and a nephew, Lt. Gaston Coblentz, Jr., of the Army Air Corps, who is now stationed in Sicily.

Funeral services will be held at 4 p. m. Thursday in Kaster and Maxon Chapel with Rabbi Joseph M. Roth, of Congregation B'nai Zion officiating. Burial will be in Restlawn Cemetery.

Pallbearers will be Raymundo Lujan, Lawrence McMahon, A. C. Lowenberg, George Villars, D. E. Sanders, and Bob Miller.

The White House Department Store will be closed Thursday in the memory of Mr. Coblentz.
