

49-YEAR RESIDENT TAKEN BY DEATH

Howard W. Coffin of 1801 East Nevada street, resident of El Paso and vicinity 49 years, died today at a local hospital. He had been ill with pneumonia.

Howard Coffin's father, C. O. Coffin, moved to El Paso in 1881. Howard Coffin was born seven years later. The family moved to a large farm, much of which is now the suburbs of Clint.

Mr. Coffin attended Boston Tech and Harvard University.

Later Mr. Coffin worked at the El Paso Foundry and at the time of his death he was a welder at the Hills-Sutton Co. shops.

Survivors are his widow, Mrs. Fanning Henning Coffin; his mother, Mrs. C. O. Coffin; three sons, William C., Charles H. and James H. Coffin; two sisters, Mrs. E. W. Earl and Mrs. G. M. Smith. All except Mrs. Smith of Manila, Philippine Is., live in El Paso.

Funeral services will be tomorrow at 3:30 p. m. at Peak-Hagedorn Mortuary. Rev. I. L. Yearby will officiate. Burial will be in Restlawn Cemetery.
