Charlee Hendricks Coldwell (October 11, 1921-May 4, 2012), who was born in El Paso, to Dr. Charles McChristie Hendricks, a prominent citizen in El Paso in the first half of the last century, and Edith Louise Duguid, passed at her home in Dallas at age 90. She attended El Paso schools graduating from Austin High School and receiving a B.A. from University of Texas at El Paso where she was a member of Zeta Tau Alpha. She married Charles H. Coldwell, July 5, 1946, in Glendale, CA. They came to Dallas in 1947. Later she received a M.A. in Library Science from East Texas State University. She became a teacher and librarian at Lakehill Preparatory School, and upon retirement help found and organize the school and church libraries for Lakewood Presbyterian Church and School, where she also taught Latin. She was a member of Lakewood Presbyterian Church. She also was active in Chapter BC, P.E.O., Dallas Geological Auxiliary, Geoflorette Garden Club, and Ermanse Book

Club. She was predeceased by her husband, her parents, and three sisters, Louise Campbell (Huntington Beach, CA), Majorie Broderson (El Paso, TX) and Mary Elizabeth (May) Thurman (Anthony, NM). She is survived by her five children—daughter Edie Robertstad and son-in-law Arnold J. Robertstad, and sons Rev. David Charles Coldwell, daughter-in-law Barbara Ellis Coldwell (Buda, TX), Andrew Forgey Coldwell, daughter-in-law Eva Weir Coldwell (Orlando, FL), Charles Hendricks Coldwell, daughter-in-law Elizabeth Ann Hedgepeth Coldwell (Tallahassee, FL), and son Chris McChristie Coldwell (Dallas, TX)—and eleven grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren. A funeral service was held at Lakewood Presbyterian Church, Dallas, 1:00 PM Monday, May 7, 2012.
