

PIONEER EL PASO MAN IS BURIED

Funeral Services Are Held For Nathaniel Cordova

Funeral services were held at 9:30 a. m. today at the Holy Family Chapel for Nathaniel A. Cordova, pioneer El Pasoan.

Rev. J. Cordova, friend of the family, who officiated at the wedding of Nathaniel Cordova and his bride, Miss Pomposa Ochoa, many years ago, was officiant. Burial was in Concordia Cemetery.

Mr. Cordova was 63. He came to El Paso in 1879 with his father, a Methodist missionary.

Mr. Cordova had lived here continuously since 1881. He was a member of the El Paso volunteer Fire Department, joining in 1891. He had been a Pullman conductor on the National Railways of Mexico, between El Paso and Mexico City, for 27 years.
