J. F. Crosby, Jr.

Death claimed a bright young El Paso man in Chicago yesterday, in the person of J. F. Crosby, Jr., son of the late judge J. F. Crosby and Mrs. Josephine B. Crosby. The death of the young man was sudden and was the result of a severe attack of typhoid fever. The mother of deceased and his brother-in-law, H. R. Wood, reached his bedside 12 hours before death and will return with the remains to this city, leaving there this afternoon on the Golden State limited and reaching El Paso Saturday if the train is on time. The deceased was born in Houston, Tex., 36 years ago, and spent a great part of his life in this city. He was a graduate of Columbia college in New York. He leaves, besides his mother, six sisters, Mrs. H. R. Wood, Mrs. Percy L. Faskally and Misses Josephine and Yndita Crosby, of this city; Mrs. Garrett Hardcastle, of Houston, and Mrs. E. Percy Moran, of New York city, and one brother, William, who is now in Mexico, where he is engaged in mining. The funeral arrangements will not be announced till after the body is brought home.
