Louis Daeuble III, Artist, Educator, and Peace Activist dies at age 67.



Born on February 24 1942 to prominent El Paso Architect Louis Daeuble Jr., and Margaret Barron Daeuble, Louis was known for his vivid paintings of the Southwest and Mexico, his impassioned teaching, and his dedication to world peace. Louis died as a result of a swimming accident near Puerto Vallarta, Mexico on February 10, 2010. Graduating Valedictorian from El Paso High, he went on to earn his degree from Stanford University in 1963. He later joined the Peace Corps and served in Columbia working in Agricultural and Rural Development. He received a scholarship from the Peace Corps and earned his Masters Degree from Columbia University. In

1971 he moved to New Mexico, was married to Lela Hilton, and farmed in the Rio Grand Valley. His two children, Joshua Easter Daeuble and Anna River Daeuble, were born there. While living in New Mexico he worked for the State Planning Office, and was elected as Mayerdomo of his community irrigation association. In 1992 he returned to El Paso and received his teaching certification from UTEP. He taught in El Paso public schools, and most recently was teaching art classes in the Lifelong Learning Department of UTEP. Louis was also an active member of the Boarder Peace Presence. He is survived by his two children, Josh and Anna, of Seattle, WA, by his mother, Margaret Daeuble, his siblings Mike and Ann Daeuble, and their children. He was preceded in death by his father Louis Daeuble, Jr. A celebration of Louis's life will be held at The Church of St Clement in the McKee Chapel, With Reverend Bill Frances officiating, on Wednesday February 24th, at 2 PM.
