

El Paso Woman Arranges Burial Before Death

Police today used an inhalator for more than an hour in a vain effort to save the life of Mrs. Maria Daguerre, 63. She died at her home at 808 Mundy Ave. from bronchitis and a heart attack.

Mrs. Daguerre had a premonition of death on Nov. 8 and called officials of Hartford Mortuary to her home.

"I know I will die in a few weeks," she said.

Then she discussed details of her funeral.

She selected her casket and funeral flowers.

Shortly before Mrs. Daguerre died, Dr. Molinar Y Rey called Fr. Joseph C. M. Garde, who administered last rites.

Police Sgt. R. E. McKnight and Policeman H. S. Bernhardt made an attempt to revive Mrs. Daguerre with the police inhalator, but she died at 10 a. m.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 9:30 a. m. in the Holy Family Church with Father Garde officiating.

Mrs. Daguerre will be buried beside her husband in accordance with her last wish in Evergreen Cemetery.

Survivors are: Two sisters, Mrs. Clotilde Terrazas, Las Cruces, N. M., Mrs. Amelia Garcia, El Paso, and two brothers, Juan and Francisco Amador, both of El Paso.
