

MISS MARY DANIELL E. P. PIONEER, DIES

Had Lived In City Since 1881;
Funeral Monday

Miss Mary Louise Daniell, pioneer resident of El Paso, died today at her home, 1201 N. Brown St. She was 89.

Miss Daniell had lived in El Paso since 1881. Her residence here since that time had been broken by several trips to other Texas cities but she always returned to El Paso.

Miss Daniell was a native Texan. She was born at Independence, Tex., and never had been outside the boundaries of the state, her sister, Mrs. Julia Sanders, also of 1201 N. Brown St., said.

Miss Daniell lived all her life with Mrs. Sanders. They came to El Paso together and saw the city grow up from a one-story adobe cow town.

Miss Daniell was a charter member of the Trinity Methodist Church but had not attended services since she was injured in a fall in her home 15 years ago.

Funeral services will be held Monday in the Easter & Maxon chapel with Rev. L. L. Evans officiating. Burial will be in Evergreen.
