

CALHOUN DAVIS DEAD.

PASSED AWAY LAST NIGHT AT
HOTEL DIEU.

Brother of Capt. Charles Davis Succumbed to Pneumonia After Five Days' Illness—Prominent Ranch Owner With Many Friends in El Paso.

Calhoun Davis died last night at 11 o'clock at Hotel Dieu. Mr. Davis was stricken with pneumonia five days before his untimely death, and although the best that medical skill could devise was done for him in his illness, all efforts were in vain, and the hand of the grim reaper gathered the well known El Pasoan into the innumerable fold of the dead.

Mr. Davis is survived by his only brother, Capt. Charles Davis, former mayor of El Paso, and the members of his immediate family. The deceased was born in Arkansas 58 years ago, and was raised in Brazos county, this state.

In 1882 he moved to El Paso and invented in several ranches. At the time of his death he was owner of a large, and valuable, ranch in the Guadalupe mountains of New Mexico, and was identified with other interests of El Paso and her tributary country. He was unmarried, and was devoted to his brother's family.

The greater part of the time Mr. Davis spent with his brother in this city, where he was widely known, and where he has a host of friends who will mourn his lamented death.

The funeral arrangements have not been perfected yet, but interment will be made in Evergreen cemetery.
