MR. LESLIE DAVIS, 73, a resident of El Paso for more than 40 years, passed away November 7, 1997. He was retired from Raytheon Company where he had been an aerospace engineer contributing to the design and development of several guided missile and space systems including the Apollo Lunar Lander, the Hawk and the Patriot missiles. Serving as a Master Sergeant in the US Marine Corps, Mr. Davis was a veteran of WWII and the Korean War who participated in the Guadalcanal and Solomon Islands campaigns. Mr. Davis earned a BIS from NMSU, a MA and MBA from Webster University. He had an avid interest in archaeology and was a Fellow of the Royal Anthropological Institute of Great Britain and Ireland, a past president of the Texas Archaeological Society, and a member of the El Paso Archaeological Society for 34 years. He served on the Wilderness Park Museum Committee during its design and construction of the museum. In 1964 he received the Instituto Interamericano Award of Honor. Mr. Davis is listed in the Who's Who in America, 1991; Who's Who in the West, 1979, 1991; Who's Who in Aviation and Aerospace, 1983; and the International Who's Who in Community Service (Cambridge, Eng.) 1979.
