

Death of B. F. Deal.

The TIMES has a sorrowful duty to perform in chronicling the death of B. F. Deal, which took place at Warrensburg, Mo., on the 16th instant. He was the pioneer of journalism in El Paso, having started the Herald here after bringing the printing materials from Colorado in a wagon. This was early in 1881. He was a native of Iowa and removed in his fourteenth year of his age to Missouri, where he learned the printer's trade. About two years ago Mr. Deal, who appeared then in perfect health, was attacked by consumption, the seeds of which had been lurking in his system since youth, and nothing that care or medical skill could do, availed. He died at Warrensburg, Mo., his former home, among friends and acquaintances, who with a disconsolate widow mourn his untimely loss. May the turf be green on his grave!
