

MRS. JOHN M. DEAN, PIONEER, IS DEAD

Was Widow of Late Judge John M. Dean and Prominent in Charitable and Church Work.

Mrs. Louise Haggart Dean, widow of the late judge John M. Dean, died at her home, 716 Myrtle avenue, Tuesday afternoon between 3:30 and 4 o'clock, after a prolonged illness. Funeral services, conducted by Rev. Henry Easter, will be held at the Church of St. Clement, this afternoon at 4 o'clock and interment will be made in Evergreen cemetery, beside the body of her husband, who was laid to rest there four years ago.

Louise Haggart was born in the city of New Orleans, La., 43 years ago and in early childhood moved to Fort Worth, Texas, with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. S. B. Haggart. There, at the age of 17 years, she married John M. Dean, of El Paso, and with him came to El Paso immediately after the ceremony.

She was a pioneer El Pasoan, and had seen strenuous days and had undergone many hardships in the then new country of the southwest. She had made her home in El Paso continuously since that day. When she and her husband, Judge John M. Dean, were in Chicago, Ill., in August, 1909, Mr. Dean died. She brought his body back to El Paso and it was buried here, funeral services being held in the home, where Mrs. Dean died Tuesday.

Mrs. Dean was a daughter of the Confederacy. Her father, who survives her, is of one of the most prominent New York families and was building inspector of El Paso under mayors Jos. U. Sweeney, W. L. Robinson and C. E. Kelly.

Always interested in charitable work, Mrs. Dean was active in the affairs of the Church of St. Clement and was at one time president of the Woman's Charity association.

Surviving her are her parents, Mr. and Mrs. S. B. Haggart, three sisters, Mrs. Henry S. Beach, of El Paso; Mrs. E. E. Hoffman, of Fort Worth, and Mrs. A. P. Ferguson, of Wichita Falls, Texas, and four brothers, Thomas B. Walter S., DeWitt C., and Horace D. Haggart, all of Fort Worth, Texas. All of these relatives and Jay C. Dean, of Denver, Colo., a brother of her late husband, had been here for several days.
