Paso. She was raised in
south El Paso where she
attended St. Ignatius
School She started work. School. She started working as an apprentice beautician in a lucrative beauty salon in the Mills Building. She continued working at Jacks Beauty Shop and eventually purchased the shop in the booming 1940's. Mrs. Dodds was not only a pioneer in Hispanic women entrepeneurs but was perhaps one of the first to solely own a major business interest in downness interest in down-town El Paso. Jacks Beauty Shop had El Paso's elite women as clients and catered to many of El Raso's Influ-ential women of that era. She owned and operated the shop until her retirement. Mrs. Dodds Was married to her prede-ceased husband LTC Arthur D. Dodds who also left a a historical background. As a highly decorated member of the Flying Tigers he was one the first military pliots to fly over France during the WWI. Upon his relirement, Col. and Mrs. Dodds were longtime residents of Las Cruces, N.M

Both were active members of veterans and veterans' auxillary units and served in sev-eral capacities. While there Mrs. Dodds received several awards for her ceramic art. She is survived by her sister, Juana Moreno Acosta, and her sister-in-law, Mary V.
