

### Death of M. A. Dolan.

Ex-Alderman Michael A. Dolan, an old and highly respected citizen and business man of El Paso, died suddenly at his residence about 8 last evening. Mr. Dolan had been confined to his bed for some days, but was not regarded as dangerously ill, though he had weak lungs and had been feeble for a long time. At the hour named, while no one was present in the room except a boy, he quietly breathed his last. Dr. Butler was called in, but it was too late. It was the prevailing opinion that death was caused by something like dropsy of the lungs. Deceased was a native of Evansville, Ind., aged about 34 years, and leaves a wife and one child. The funeral will take place this afternoon. The body will be taken from the late residence of deceased, corner of Chihuahua and West Overland streets, to the Catholic church at 1:30, and after the services it will be returned to the undertaking parlors adjoining the Star stables, where it will be turned over to the Uniform Rank Knights of Pythias, of which order deceased was a member, and at 3 p. m. the funeral cortege will move for Concordia.
