

Mrs. John Donohue, Pioneer Club Woman, Summoned By Death

Funeral services for Mrs. John Donohue, 57 years old, a pioneer El Paso woman, who died Monday night in her late home, 214 Franklin street, will be held Wednesday afternoon at her home. Rev. Mr. Henry Buchanan will officiate.

Mrs. Donohue died after an illness lasting over a period of three years. She came to El Paso 24 years ago and had lived here continuously since that time. She was a native of Leavenworth, Kan. Her husband, who died 11 years ago, was a prominent railroad man.

She was a member of the Woman's club and the Pioneer Woman's club and as a member of a committee with Richard Caples and Mrs. Leigh Clark, she was instrumental in having the site in front of her home turned into the present Cleveland square. She was also prominent in many activities until a few years ago, when her health failed.

The survivors are three sons, Eugene P., a student in the University of Arizona; John W., of the First National bank; Edward C., traveling freight and passenger agent for the Santa Fe railroad; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. E. C. Donohue, and a niece, Mrs. E. E. Wiseman, all of El Paso; two brothers, Charles G. Schneible, of El Paso, and John Schneible, of Fort Scott, Kan.; two sisters, Mrs. J. A. Schumacher, of Shreveport, La., and Mrs. Bert Hawley, of Boynton, Okla.
