

Founder Of Grand Hotel Dies In Tulsa, Okla., Brother Of Mrs. McCoy

The body of Joseph M. Dougher, 41 years old, son of John Dougher, founder of El Paso's first hotel, the Grand Central, will arrive in El Paso Sunday from Tulsa, Okla., where death occurred following a heart attack, August 16.

Mr. Dougher was a brother of Mrs. W. M. McCoy, of the Hotel McCoy, which now stands on the site of the old Grand Central. He was born in Las Vegas, N. M., but spent his early life in El Paso, remaining here until 15 years ago.

Besides Mrs. McCoy, a widow and one brother, John E. Dougher, of Los Angeles, survive. Mr. Dougher was traveling for a Los Angeles firm when he took ill. Mrs. Dougher was in Columbus, Ga. She went to Tulsa and will accompany the body here.

Parents of Mr. Dougher are buried in Concordia cemetery. Simmons-Hardtford company will have charge of the funeral arrangements.
