

A PIONEER OF EL PASO PASSES AWAY

Mrs. Bridget Dunne Dies at Age of 65.—Other Local Deaths.

One of the first white women to settle in El Paso, Mrs. Mary Bridget Dunne, 65 years of age, died Sunday morning at her home in East El Paso. She came to El Paso with her family in 1881.

Mrs. Dunne was born in Milton, county Clare, Ireland, Jan. 28, 1840. Her maiden name was Talty. When a young girl she was married to Patrick Conway Dunne, who lived in Crawfordsville, Ind. She was married in 1863.

During the early part of her married life Mrs. Dunne lived in Chicago, where a number of sons and daughters, who have since taken a prominent part in the affairs of the southwest, were born.

Twenty-four years ago she came to El Paso with her husband and growing family. Her children, all of whom survive her, are George, who lives in El Paso; W. J., John W., James and Edwin, Arizona; Joe, Charles and Miss Mamie Dunne, of El Paso, and Mrs. M. Steadman of Torreon.

The funeral procession will leave the Dunne home in East El Paso at 8:30 Tuesday morning, proceeding to the church of the Immaculate Conception, when the services will be held. Interment will be in Evergreen cemetery.
